

Tin-Nickel SLOTOLOY NIT 10

The fluoride-containing Tin-Nickel SLOTOLOY NIT 10 deposits brightness-retaining alloy-coatings composed of approx. 65 % by weight tin and 35 % by weight nickel. The process is used to coat copper, brass, nickel etc.. Tin-Nickel SLOTOLOY NIT 10 can be run on a wide current density range of approx. 0.1 to 2.0 A/dm². The same make-up is suitable for both rack and barrel plating. The electro deposited alloy is very resistant to corrosion and tarnishing. Over the whole current density range and the temperature maintained within the specified operating parameters the colour is similar to the one of stainless steel.

The information in this data sheet is based on laboratory as well as practical experience. Figures quoted for operating limits and replenishment quantities are for guidance. Actual values necessary will depend on the components being plated (material and geometry), their application and plating plant conditions.
